### Magway Region Government Decided to Shut Down UKT Alcohol Factory in Aunglan

Wednesday, 29 th June 2016

Magway region government decided to shut down UKT Alcohol Factory in Aunglan on 22<sup>nd</sup> June. U Myint Zaw, the Minister of Labor, Employment and Immigration, said that the Chief Minister of Magway Region signed off on the decision to close down the factory on 14<sup>th</sup> June and it was decided by holding a cabinet meeting in accord with procedures.

Magway Region Hluttaw Committee for Natural Resources, Environment, Electricity and Energy made a field investigation to UKT Alcohol Factory. Later U Aye Kyaw who is an MP from Aunglan Constituency (2) submitted a proposal.

When U Myint Zaw, the Minister of Labor, Employment and Immigration, paid a visit to Aunglan on 30<sup>th</sup> April, he found out about stench and contaminated water from the factory, about which he presented at the cabinet meeting on 10<sup>th</sup> May. Afterwards the investigation team was formed and submitted findings on 27<sup>th</sup> May. Although


