State and Region Government Cabinets List Was Released: Small Representation of Female Ministers

Friday 22nd April 2016

According to the recently released state's gazette about State and Region Cabinets list, it presents a small proportion of female cabinets members among the positions of State and Region Cabinets.

Apart from Dr. Hla Myat Thwe for the Ministry of Social Affairs at Ayeyarwady Region, and Daw Nilar Kyaw for the Ministry of Electricity, Industry and Transportation for Yangon Region Cabinet, the rest of the cabinet positions are represented by male ministers. Since there are 89 seats in total for the cabinets for 14 States and Regions, and only two seats are occupied by female ministers, the percentage of female ministers representation is very low as about two percent.

When appointed for the cabinets, there are a couple of those who are not the MPs from National League for Democracy (NLD) party, such as Salai Issak Khin as the Minister of Municipality, Electricity and Industrial Ministry appointed in Chin State, and Daw Nilar Kyaw from Yangon Region, who involved in the State and Region government body.

U L Phoung Sho (Kayah State)

"Frankly speaking, fighting against corruption is a "must". If we could not solve the corruption problems, we will never be able to shape the development. Therefore, we must try our best to fight against it, with my principles and rules."

U Win Thein (Bago Region)

We will stand as role model in tackling with corruption. It has been years that the country has been corrupted and it was like a trend. However, we aim to educate and acknowledge the public to fight against with corruption.

U Min Min Oo (Mon State)

As my purpose, I will try to be corruption-free in my constituency area. First, I will analyze how the system is carried out and how the situation is happening there. After that, I will seek out for the solutions to tackle with those problems and corruption issues based on the analysis."
