Regional Auditor General Answered to MP's Question on Shwe Gone Dine Flyover Construction

Thursday, 2nd June 2016

On 31st May, the auditor general of Yangon Region said surplus 22 millions kyats from Shwe Gone Dine Flyover construction was found and has already been reimbursed to the Union.

Daw Sandar Min, MP from SeikgyiKanaungto constituency 1, submitted a question during the second regular session (the fifth day) of Yangon Region Hluttaw so as to find out and learn findings and reimbursement to the Union and Daw Khin Than Hla, the Auditor General of Yangon Region answered. Daw Sandar Min asked, "Was there an error in standard costing according to inspection over Shwe Gone Dine Flyover in 2013-2014 fiscal year? Did you find out the reimbursement to the Union for supplementary activities?" The Auditor General of Yangon Region replied, with receipt numbers, that the reimbursement was over 22 million kyats including the different standard costing of total budget allowances, different local standard costing, miscalculations and necessity to pay 2 percent income tax and it had already been reimbursed. In 2012, Yangon Region Government granted the permission to the Capital Development Company permission to build Shwe Gone Dine Flyover.

Toxic waste debated in Ayeyarwady Hluttaw

River pollution was discussed in the Ayeyarwady Region parliament yesterday, with one MP alleging that industrial waste from nearby factories is contaminating the water.

Daw San San Myint, a representative from Wakema township, had submitted a question in order to find a solution to what she says are chemical toxins in the Ayeyarwady River. She said the water is dangerous for people to use and would damage their health.

The MP said she had asked a laboratory to test the water and was told it was not suitable for drinking. Local residents had already reported an increase in liver diseases, she said.

In his answer to Daw San San Myint's question, the region's Minister for Agriculture, U Ba Hein, said that cooperation between locals NGOs, the authorities and the government would be essential to find a solution to the problem.

U Aung Kyaw Khine, the Speaker of Ayeyarwady Region Hluttaw, told parliament that he had paid a surprise visit to a factory in Kyonepyaw township after people had complained about the
