Motion for Preventing Child Sexual Assault Was Approved Owing to a Military Representative



13th January 2017

During the fourth regular session of Mandalay Region Hluttaw, Dr. Kyaw Oo (Aungmyaythazan 1) submitted a motion for disseminating knowledge on child sexual assault from primary school level. He submitted the motion so as to reduce and prevent child rape, to develop an educating programme for 3-to-12-year-olds for public participation.

Six MPs discussed the motion and the Chief Minister Dr. Zaw Myint Maung suggested the motion to be recorded. The motion was decided through voting and was approved owing to one vote by a military representative. Major Han Zaw Win, who voted for approval, later said that he voted on his own decision.

"The voting result showed that 35 were in favour and 34 against so the Hluttaw approved the motion," said U Aung Kyaw Oo, the Speaker.

"We do not have to do it all by ourselves. We will cooperate. We will be very glad if the educating programme is included in curriculum. For that, we will work with experts and plan with authorities," said Dr. Kyaw Oo.

Mon State Government Continues VIP Guesthouse Building Despite Hluttaw's Disapproval

Despite the Mon State Hluttaw prohibiting the construction of a VIP guesthouse at the Government Residence, in Mon State's capital, Mawlamyine, the state government is moving forward with development.

The VIP Guesthouse will be a four-storey building, and over 110 million kyats will be spent.

"The government knows the Hluttaw's decision. However, it is in their hands whether they will build it or not. On the Hluttaw's part, we did not permit the VIP Guesthouse project to go ahead but rather suggested to use the budget for projects that are beneficial

to the public. That is our decision," said Daw Tin Ei, Mon State Hluttaw Speaker.

In addition to rejecting the VIP Guesthouse proposal, the Hluttaw did not permit the State Advocate General Office building project either. Over 200 million kyats would be spent on both projects.

On 4th October 2016, at the Mon State Hluttaw conference, U Htun Min Aung, an MP of Paung Constituency (1), proposed to spend the budget for the VIP Guesthouse on projects that benefit the public. As per this proposal, the Hluttaw has approved.

However, during the Hluttaw session on 6th January 2017, Chief Minister U Min Min Oo and other Ministers re-

quested that the VIP Guesthouse project should continue since it has already started. On the other hand, the budget proposed for the State Advocate General Office would be spent on public projects.

"The motion was successful during the previous Hluttaw term. However, under this current state government's situation, it is truly necessary to have the VIP Guesthouse for government officials. Regardless, it is unsure how the Hluttaw will review the matter," said U Htun Htay, Mon State's Minister of Agriculture, and Transport and Communications.
